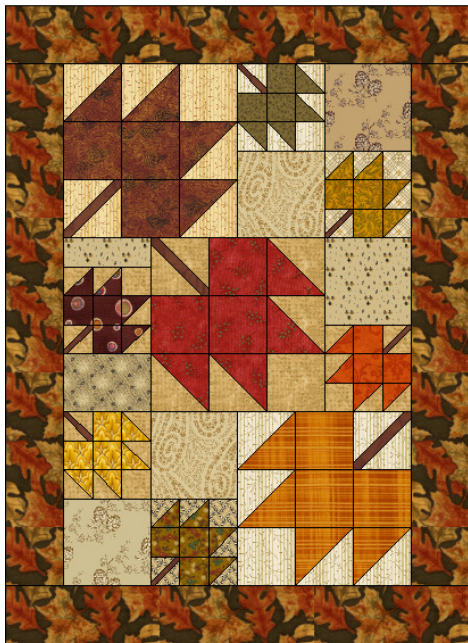


## Maple Leaf Fun



Maple Blocks  
 Make 3 6"□  
 Make 6 3"□

Finished Size of Quilt – 16" x 22"

Fabric Requirements	
3 Different Darks (one for each large maple leaf)	3" x 15"
6 Different Darks (one for each small maple leaf)	2" x 10"
3 Different Lights (one for each large maple leaf)	3" x 15"
6 Different Lights (one for each small maple leaf)	2" x 10"
3 Different Lights (for setting pieces)	3-1/2" x 10"
Dark Brown (Stems)	2-1/2" x 20"
Border	Fat Quarter
Binding	1/3 Yard

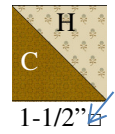
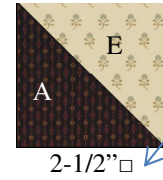
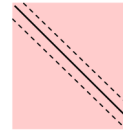
Cutting Chart	
Darks (from each 3" dark strip) A. Cut 2 B. Cut 3	3"□ 2-1/2"□
Darks (from each 2" dark strip) C. Cut 2 D. Cut 3	2"□ 1-1/2"□
Light (from each 3" light strip) E. Cut 2 F. Cut 1 G. Cut 2	3"□ 2-1/2"□ 2-1/4"□
Light (from each 2" light strip) H. Cut 2 I. Cut 1 J. Cut 2	2"□ 1-1/2"□ 1-3/8"□
Other Lights (Setting pieces) K. Cut 5 L. Cut 1 M. Cut 1	3-1/2"□ 3-1/2" x 1-1/2" 3-1/2" x 2-1/2"
Stems (dark brown) N. Cut 3 O. Cut 6	2-1/2"□ 1-1/2"□
Border P. Cut 2 (left and right borders) Q. Cut 2 (top and bottom borders)	2-1/2" x 18-1/2" 2-1/2" x 16-1/2"

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## Half Square Triangles

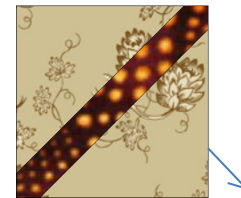
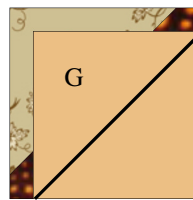
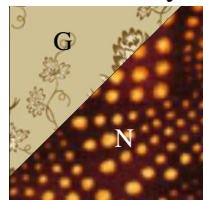
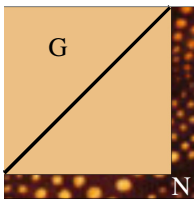
- Place Light and Dark pieces (A and Es for large blocks and C and Hs for small blocks) right sides together. On wrong side of Light draw a diagonal line corner to corner. Stitch  $\frac{1}{4}$ " from drawn line on both sides.



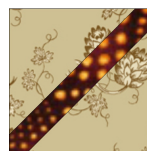
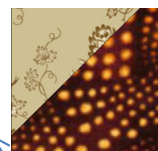
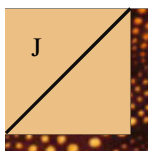
- Using your favorite square-up ruler, trim A/E units to  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " and C/H units to  $1\frac{1}{2}$ ". I personally love the Tucker Trimmer 1™ for trimming units. If you can't find this ruler at your local quilt shop, you can purchase from Deb Tucker's Studio 180 Design.

## Stem Section

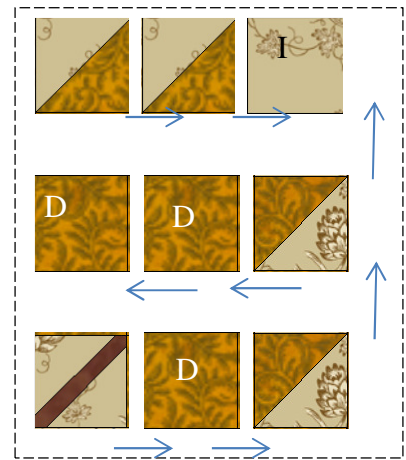
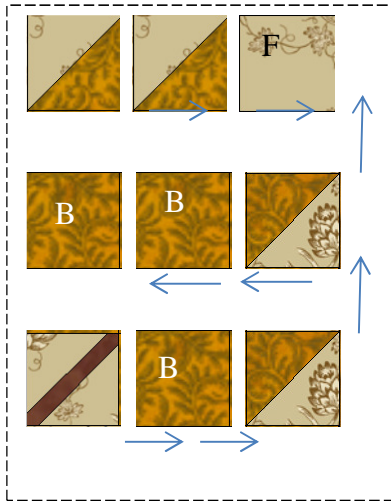
- Draw diagonal lines on pieces G and J
- Put G on upper left corner of Stem N
- Sew on diagonal line.
- Press the small square toward upper left corner.
- Repeat with another G on lower right corner. These are for the Large Maple Leaf Blocks.
- Optional – trim the middle layer of fabric  $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the seam



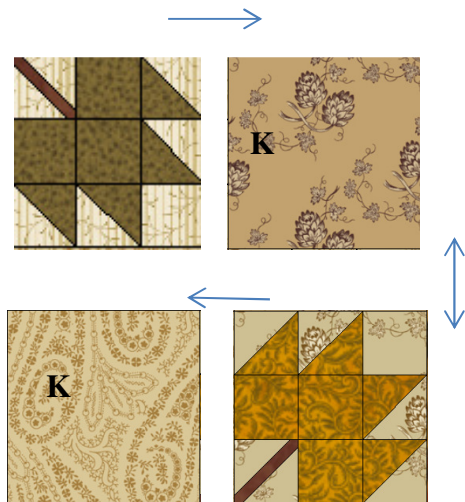
- Repeat with piece Js on Stem Os. These are for the small Maple Leaf Blocks.



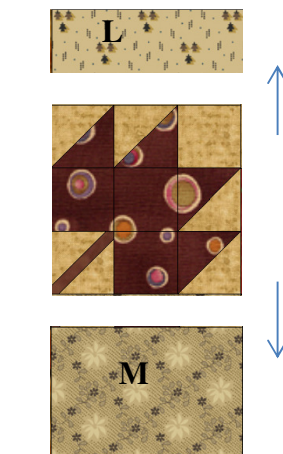
- Combine half square triangle units, stem units and remaining squares in rows per diagram.
- Combine rows.



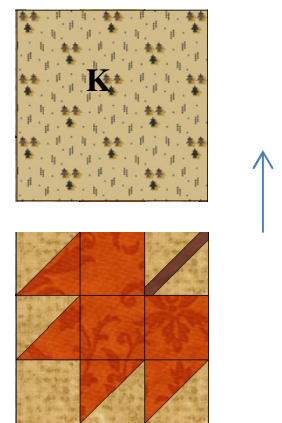
- Combine Small Maple Leaf blocks with remaining Background setting squares.



Make 2. Large block measures 6-1/2"□



Make 1. Block measures 3-1/2" x 6-1/2"



Make 1. Block measures 3-1/2" x 6-1/2"

- Arrange Maple Leaf Units into Rows.
- Combine rows.
- Add borders.
